After driving around looking for the girls or after we dropped our dates off, we gather up at the Western Bowl and have a few last ones for the night. We talk about our dates, the girls we did not date and our plans for the next week.

I remember a time when we were out cruising and we stopped by one of the local hangouts. I was not old enough to buy beer but I had my brother's draft card - the golden pass in our day. We were talking with the girls as usual, I was in one booth and Bob in another. All of sudden Bob come over all excited and says, "We got to get out of here." What's up Bob. I'm just getting to know these girls. Bob says, "The cops are here and are checking ID. The cops was at the booth right next to us. We broke out. We drove by later and the place was locked up. The place was busted for selling beer to minors. Bob was my guardian angel that night.

Bob was real intelligent fellow. He was going to XU taking some physiology course. He would explain all about those cells and body parts. He really seem to like that kind of stuff.

We drifted apart as he worked for Pepsi. I worked for Emery Industries and went to UC night school. Then the day can when I went to the Federal Building downtown to be inducted into the US Army. Who but Bob walked through the door that day along with a few other draft dodgers. We did basic training with the Fourth Training Brigade Fourteenth Battalion Company E, Fort Knox Ky. We were in different platoons but were able to spend time on weekends. I looked back through the training company journal last night.
